



BC Vaccine Card Requirements

Beginning September 13, 2021, the District of Taylor will be required to verify proof of vaccination using the BC Vaccine Card for certain discretionary activities.

As we have throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the District must, under Provincial Health Orders, continue to follow the Provincial Health Officer and Northern Health guidance and directions, including these new requirements.

Based on the Provincial Health Order, visitors and participants will be required to show their BC Vaccine Card and government-issued photo identification at District recreational facilities for the following activities:

- Adult fitness, sport, or dance activities for those 22 years of age and older
- Events, bookings, and gatherings of more than 50 participants

Proof of vaccination is **NOT** required for the following:

- Recreation and sport activities for those 21 years of age and under
- Leisure skating, when not associated with an event
- Workers at the workplace, including coaches and volunteers who are required to run the program
- Government activities and services, including Council Meetings

Spectators for youth sports and programs will be limited to no more than 50 people.

The BC Vaccine Card includes a secure, individualized QR code and an image showing whether a person is "vaccinated" or "partially vaccinated." People can get their BC Vaccine Card online at gov.bc.ca/vaccinecard.

As a reminder, based on Provincial Health Orders masks continue to be required in all indoor District facilities when not engaged in physical activity.
