Staff Reports

- The Committee requested that staff identify the organization that donated the tennis and pickleball court and forward correspondence with a request for feedback on transitioning the facility to a full pickleball court.

Correspondence

- Council resolved to grant authorization to the BC Peace Country River Rats for the following from June 17 – 19, 2022, and July 15 – 17, 2022, subject to appropriate Special Use Permit requirements being met, for their annual Jet Boat Races and Poker Rally events:
 - Use of Green Spaces C, D, E, and G, for truck and trailer overflow parking to support the boat parking area
 - Permission to set up a catering trailer, ATM machine, stage for a live band, generators and light towers, and the ability to provide additional capacity for participant parking on campsites 112 and 120
 - Relaxation of quiet time restrictions in Section 10.2 (a) of the *Peace Island Park Bylaw No. 807, 2016* on Saturday, June 18, 2022, and Saturday, July 16, 2022

- Council resolved to waive the District of Taylor Grants/Forgiveness/Sponsorship Policy and that the Church of the Good Shepherd be granted forgiveness of the building permit fee in the amount of \$55 for the construction of a wheelchair ramp.
- Council resolved to provide a letter in support of the Northern BC Tourism Resiliency Program.

New Business

- Council resolved to cancel the Public Works Committee Meeting scheduled on Monday, May 16, 2022.

Staff Reports

- Council resolved to defer the Taylor Seasonal Community Pool opening to 2023 and that staff investigate opportunities to partner with other local government on pool operations.
- Council resolved to grant authorization to Mayor Fraser to forward a letter to School District No. 60 inquiring about the inclusion of lifeguard certification in the high school curriculum and if the program is not offered, to request that consideration be given to incorporating the certification program into the curriculum.
- Council resolved to allocate \$3,000 from the 2022 operating surplus for the purpose of providing financial support to the Peace Country Pickleball Association for District of Taylor pickleball court upgrades.
- Council resolved to approve Development Variance Permit Application 01-2022 to permit a relaxation of the maximum height of an accessory building from 5 metres to 7 metres.
- Council resolved to adopt the Information Handling Policy and Privacy Breach Response Procedure as presented.
- Council passed a resolution to adopt 2022 Tax Rate Bylaw No. 851, 2022.

- Council passed resolutions for the first three readings of the following bylaws:

 - Election and Assent Voting Bylaw No. 854, 2022
