Committee of the Whole

Staff Reports

- The Committee reviewed the amended version of the draft Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw and agreed to proceed to public engagement
- The Committee reviewed and discussed the proposed water, sewer, and garbage fees for 2023, and agreed to pass resolutions for the first three readings at the Regular Council Meeting being held later this same day
- The Committee reviewed the draft Public Notice Bylaw and agreed to proceed with the first three readings at the next Regular Council Meeting being held on Monday, March 6, 2023

- Ms. Glenda Farnden, Senior Municipal Relations Liaison, provided an operational update on behalf of the STARS Foundation

Correspondence

- Council passed resolutions for the BC Peace Country River Rats' Jet Boat Race event being held from June 30 – July 3, 2023, and their Poker Rally event being held from July 14 – 17, 2023 (subject to appropriate Special Use Permit requirements):
 - Authorization to use Green Spaces C, D, E, and F, for truck and trailer overflow parking to support the boat parking area
 - Permission to set up a catering trailer, ATM machine, stage for a live band, generators, and light towers, and the ability to provide additional capacity for participant parking on campsites 112 and 120
 - Authorization for late check-outs on each Monday following the events, to provide an adequate amount of time for full clean up and tear down

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- Authorization to relax quiet time restrictions in Section 10.2(a) of *Peace Island Park Bylaw No. 807, 2016* and authorization for an extension to 1:00 a.m. for the live band performances scheduled during each event
- Requirement to meet with the Fire Chief to discuss emergency planning for both events
- Council resolved to provide a letter in support of the Peace Region Food Action Hub Agricultural Extension Institute's grant funding application to South Peace Mackenzie Trust

Staff Reports

- Council passed a resolution to ratify the Council Survey Poll decision surrounding the Travis La Fleur Memorial Service which provided authorization for the following:
 - Closure of all District of Taylor non-essential operations from 10:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 16, 2023, to allow all staff to attend the memorial service
 - Varying of the District Contribution to Funeral Events Policy to allow staff to provide a \$500 provision to cover any incidental costs associated with the memorial service

- Council passed resolutions for the first three readings of District of Taylor Water, Sewer, and Garbage Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 861, 2023 and 2023 - 2027 Financial Plan Bylaw No. 862, 2023
