# District of Taylor Responsible Pet Ownership and Backyard Hen and Bee Bylaw Engagements What We Heard

The District of Taylor is a welcoming community and an excellent place to live and work. Part of ensuring community safety, citizenship, and small-town character is the regular review of municipal policies and bylaws.

In the spring of 2023 Council engaged with citizens about Dogs and Cats (Responsible Pet Ownership) and Back yard Hens and Bees. Draft versions of bylaws were created using recommendations from the province of BC, the Community Charter, our comparative communities, and the SPCA. The next step in bylaw creation is to engage with our citizens.

Here is what we heard.

### Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw

Citizens are in favor of implementing a cat licensing program, many survey takers cited issues with neighbors' cats, such as property damage, annoyance, and defecation on their properties.

Responders indicated that they believe bylaw officers should be able to impound at large cats, and

that a limit of 3 cats per household is appropriate.

Citizens would also like to be informed about the presence of dangerous dogs in the community.

### Backyard Hen and Bees Bylaw

Respondents agreed that implementing a Backyard Hen and Bee Bylaw is necessary for Taylor. Citizens indicated that a limit of 6 hens per household would be appropriate.

Citizens also advocated for regular caretaking and wellbeing checks on the animals by the District Bylaw Officers.

#### **Next Steps**

Staff will review the draft bylaws to ensure that they reflect what we heard and present them to Council for their review. If council is happy with the content the Bylaw will be presented for approval which requires four readings by council over at least two regular meetings of Council.

Council meetings and agendas are published on our website and members of the public are welcome to attend open council meetings.

- In person visit the District office at 10007 100A Street and pay with Interac, credit card, cash, or cheque.

## What happens if I don't pay on time?

- A 10% penalty will apply to any overdue balance, including any unclaimed Homeowner Grants.
- If taxes remain delinquent the property could be subject to tax sale.


# Fire Prevention Week Slogan Contest

# **Evacuation Tips**

Monitor conditions and follow the advice of local authorities. If ordered to evacuate, do so immediately.



Review your evacuation plan for your family

· Visit www.getprepared.gc.ca for helpful tips and evacuation plan templates.



Have your "ready to go kit" (emergency kit) ready and stocked with cash, portable radio, prescription medications, eye glasses, change of clothes, pet food, flashlights and batteries, etc. Make sure your phone numbers, insurance information and other important documents for your go bag are current.

- · Turn off air conditioning.
- . Turn off your electricity and gas.
- · Close all doors, garage doors and windows. If weather seal or doors have gaps, seal with duct tape.

# Quickly address outside surroundings

Complete a scan around your home and property and take steps to remove combustibles.



Remove leaves, pine needles and other debris from your roof and gutters.




Mow grass and weeds within 10 metres of the house to 10 centimetres in length, or less.



Clear all dead plants, leaves, and weeds within 10 metres of your home. Maintain a 1.5 metre non-combustible zone around your home and deck by sweeping or raking down to mineral soil, rock or concrete.



Move combustible items, such as toys, patio furniture, cushions, decorative items, firewood, and potted plants, that are on and under your deck and within 10 metres of your home. Move all combustible items into your home or garage.



- · Propane tanks should be moved to 10 metres away from structures.
- · Remove weeds and other debris from area around large stationary propane tanks so there is no combustible material near tank.

If you have a combustible fence that attaches to your home:

- · Secure gate in an open position.
- · Clear vegetation and debris along both sides of combustible fence lines.



# Check around the house


Check vents on roof, foundation and exterior walls to prevent embers from entering your home.



Check your attic and foundation (crawl space) vents to see if they are screened and in good repair. Use duct or metal tape to temporarily cover damaged vents and those with 3 millimetre mesh screening.



If you store cardboard boxes and other easily ignited materials near a vent in your attic or crawl space, move them as far away as possible from vent(s).





Cover dryer vents and wall-mounted make-up air openings for furnaces with a plywood cover, metal tape or duct tape.

# PUBLIC NOTICE – WATERING RESTRICTIONS

As previously advertised, the District has enacted Taylor bylaw 716, 2006, in compliance with provincial initiatives to conserve water. Stage 1 Water Use Restrictions are in effect FROM MAY 1<sup>st</sup> TO SEPTEMBER 30<sup>th</sup> INCLUSIVE as follows:

# STAGE 1 - REDUCED LAWN WATERING

- 1.1 During Stage 1:
  - a) No person shall use a sprinkler to water a lawn growing on a property.
    - i. Except ON AN ODD NUMBERED DAY BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 6:00AM TO 8:00AM AND 8:00PM TO 10:00PM INCLUSIVE.

This bylaw gives the water system enough time to recuperate and prepare for the next watering day. Please adhere to these hours so that the District of Taylor does not need to enact Stage 2 restrictions that greatly reduce water use for residences, with Stage 3 banning sprinklers entirely.

Watering outside of these times puts a strain on the water system that serves residences with potable drinking water, as well it provides the required water for Fire Protection. Thank you for following these restricted hours as it aids in there being enough safe drinking water for all necessary activities.

# District of Taylor Garbage Day Reminders



Garbage is picked up every Tuesday and your bin must be placed beside the street by 8:00am. The handle and wheels need to face the property while the side with the silver bar should be facing the street. The bin must be placed on the property side of the sidewalk, if your street has a sidewalk.

Important bylaw info listed below; the complete bylaw is available on districtoftaylor.com:

- 5.2 All Garbage within Standard Garbage Containers must be contained within plastic bags.
- 6.5 An Owner or occupier must store a Standard Garbage Container with the lid closed at all times. The Standard Garbage Container must not, at any time, be filled with Garbage to the extent that the lid does not close.
- 6.9 The Owner or occupier shall be responsible for the protection of the Standard Garbage Container against upset or spillage at all times. Spilled or upset waste clean-up shall be the responsibility of the Owner or occupier.
- 7.2 All Standard Garbage Containers shall be kept, maintained and readily accessible for emptying, by 8:00 a.m. on the day of collection.
- 7.2.1 All Standard Garbage Containers must be placed for pick up no more than 24 hours prior to collection and must be removed within 24 hours of being emptied.
- 7.3.1 On the scheduled collection day, the Owner or occupier must place the Standard
  Garbage Container in a location free from obstructions at least one (1) metre horizontally
  on all sides of the cart and three (3) metres vertically above the Standard Garbage
  Container.

Cooperation for the above is greatly appreciated. It is important to follow these reminders so that Public Works can maintain the sidewalks in the winter and for the pedestrians that use them.

### **Handy Dart Services**

### Is Handy Dart right for me?

handyDART is an accessible, door-to-door shared transit service for people with permanent or temporary disabilities that prevent them from using fixed-route transit without assistance from another person. handyDART picks you up at your accessible door and drops you off at the accessible door of your destination. Customers must first register, at no charge, for this program.

handyDART is part of the Accessible Services offered from your local transit service. Many handyDART customers use a combination of fixed-route and handyDART services depending on their travel needs and destination.

Two types of accessible transit service are offered: shared door-to-door handyDART service and fixed-route service. Fixed-route service includes either low-floor buses with ramps, or lift-equipped buses on fixed routes and schedules.

Fixed-route buses have securements for wheelchairs or scooters. To check if a stop is accessible, call your local transit office. Customers using wheelchairs or scooters, registered handyDART customers or CNIB pass holders may travel with an attendant. Attendants travel free and must board and exit at the same stop as the customer requiring assistance and help load and secure mobility aids on the bus.

### How to book a trip

You must first be registered with handyDART before booking a trip. Subscription trips are scheduled once a week or more at the same location and time for an extended period. An example would be a biweekly physical therapy appointment. To request this service, you must contact handyDART to check availability. Subscription trips are cancelled on holidays. Renal patients should check with the hospital and handyDART for holiday service. You must contact handyDART if you need to keep a trip on a holiday.

### **Booking Check List**

When you book a trip, please have this information ready:

- Your name
- The day, date and time you need to travel
- Identify if you have an attendant or companion or an assistance animal
- Your pick-up address street name and number
- Your drop-off address street name and number and phone number if available
- Your appointment time
- Any special instructions (e.g. side door)
- Type of mobility aid you will be using (wheelchair, walker, etc.)

Reservation trips are one time or occasional trips. These trips are scheduled on a first-to-call basis. You need to book a trip in advance of the date required but no more than 14 days in advance.

handyDART resources are limited and always in demand. If you must cancel a trip, it is important that you call the handyDART office as soon as you can. By cancelling as far in advance as possible, you help us improve service to all our passengers.

### Reservations

Online Bookings: The cutoff for purchasing tickets online is 24 hours prior to departure.

Phone Bookings: Passengers booking over the phone must book at least 3 hours prior to departure. Phone bookings can be made daily between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm at 1-844-564-7494.

Walk-up Tickets: We recommend booking in advance, however, passengers may show up at a stop and pay the driver (debit or credit card only) based on availability. Cash is not accepted.

### Arrive at the bus stop on time

Arrive at the designated pick-up location 15-20 minutes prior to departure. Buses operate on a schedule and cannot wait for late passengers. Consequently, missing bus results in rescheduling and paying for a new reservation.

#### Cancellation

Please cancel your ticket a minimum of 24 hours in advance to receive a full refund.

In the event that BC Bus North cancels your trip, reservations are refunded.

# Mom's Mashed Potato Salad

This mashed potato salad can be made with or without the chopped egg. This is the only kind of potato salad my dad will eat. Try it, and you'll see why!

# Ingredients

6 medium Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and quartered

1 small sweet onion, diced

3 large hard-cooked eggs, chopped

1/2 cup diced celery

1/4 cup chopped sweet pickles

salt and ground black pepper to taste

1 cup mayonnaise

1/3 cup sweet pickle juice

1 teaspoon prepared yellow mustard

# **Directions**

#### Step 1

Place potatoes into a large pot and cover with salted water; bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to medium-low and simmer until tender, about 20 minutes. Drain.

#### Step 2

Transfer potatoes to a large bowl and mash with a potato masher. Stir in onion, eggs, celery, pickles, salt, and pepper.

#### Step 3

Mix mayonnaise, pickle juice, and mustard together in a separate bowl; pour over potatoes and mix until well combined. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour before serving.
