Have you Received Your 2025 Property Tax Notice?

Property tax notices were issued and mailed on May 20, 2025.

The deadline for 2025 property tax payments and homeowner grant applications was **July 2, 2025**.

What if I didn't get mine?

- Call or visit the District of Taylor Office.

How do I pay?

- Online – if you bank with North Peace Savings and Credit Union, Bank of Montreal, TD Bank, or Scotia Bank
- Over the phone – by calling the District of Taylor office with a credit card
- By mail – send cash or check to PO Box 300, Taylor, BC V0C 2K0
(subject to postal service availability)
- In person – visit the District of Taylor office at 10007 100A Street and pay with credit card, cash, check or by Interac

What happens if I didn't pay on time?

- A 10% penalty will be applied to any overdue balance, including any unclaimed Homeowner Grants.
- Interest will start to accumulate on all overdue tax balances.
- If taxes remain delinquent (overdue for more than 2 years) the property could be subject to tax sale.

Have You Paid Your Utility Bill?



The 2025 discount period is now closed. 2025 utility bills are due by **December 31, 2025**. If your bill has not been paid in full by this date, a 10% penalty will be applied, and all remaining balances will be rolled into your property taxes.

There are four convenient ways to pay:

- Online – If you bank with North Peace Savings and Credit Union, Bank of Montreal, TD Bank, or Scotia Bank
- Over the phone – by calling the District of Taylor office with a credit card
- By mail – send cash or check to PO Box 300, Taylor, BC V0C 2K0
(subject to postal service availability)
- In person – visit the District of Taylor office at 10007 100A Street and pay with credit card, cash, check or by Interac

What You Need to Know About Municipal Tax Sale

What is a municipal tax sale?

- The sale of property by the municipality for the collection of delinquent property taxes.

When are property taxes considered delinquent?

- December 31st, two years after the tax was first due. 2023 taxes are now delinquent.

What is the payment deadline to keep my property off the tax sale list?

- September 26, 2025 at 4:30 pm*

When is the tax sale?

- Tax Sale is held on the last Monday in September annually.
- For 2025, Tax Sale will be held on September 29, 2025 at 10:00 a.m.

Please ensure your mailing address is up to date and keep an eye out for mailed reminders for more information.

***If delinquent taxes and/or interest are still unpaid as of September 19, 2025, the owners name and address may be subject to publication as per BC Legislation.**

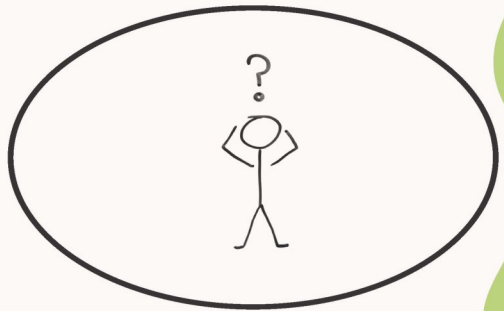
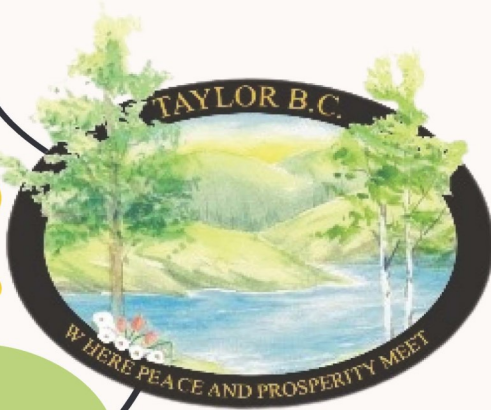

EVENT BREAKDOWN



Class A - Certified professional

- Invited professional competitors complete three rounds of gold panning, aiming to keep as many gold flakes or nuggets in their pan as possible while finishing quickly. Each round increases in difficulty, ending with a search for a larger gold nugget.

Class B - Non professional and winner from the juvenile open

- Competitors 14 years old and above complete three rounds of gold panning, aiming to keep as many gold flakes or nuggets in their pan as possible while finishing quickly. Each round increases in difficulty, ending with a search for a larger gold nugget.

Class C Adult & Juvenile

- Find the pennyweight nugget hidden in a gold pan filled with gravel and sand as quickly as possible within the time limit.

Media/Celeb/Sponsor

- Community representatives are invited to find the pennyweight nugget hidden in a gold pan filled with gravel and sand as quickly as possible within the time limit.

Juvenile Open

- Panner's typically range 10 years up to 14 years old. Competitors complete three rounds of gold panning, aiming to keep as many gold flakes or nuggets in their pan as possible while finishing quickly. Each round increases in difficulty, ending with a search for a larger gold nugget.

Claim Staking Adult & Juvenile

- Pace out a given measurement from a starting point and place your stake in the ground. Winner is determined by who is closest to the measurement.

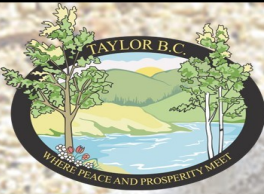
Metal Detecting Adult & Juvenile

- Adults must have their own metal detector. Use your metal detector to find as many hidden coins as possible within the marked area. The participant who finds the most coins wins!
- Register for the competition or just try it out with our metal detectors provided on site!

Bannock Baking

- Competitors must bake bannock using only the provided ingredients and equipment (except for their own axe), within one hour and in a single attempt. Anyone under 14 must have adult supervision for fire and cooking, and judging is based on appearance, texture, and taste.

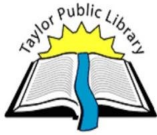

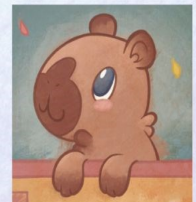

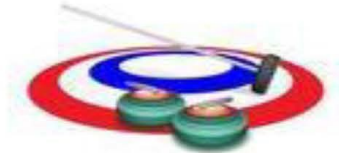
