#### Fire Prevention Week

This year the National Fire Protection Association is celebrating Fire Prevention Week from **October** 5<sup>th</sup> - 11<sup>th</sup>. The theme for this year is "Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home"

Join us for **BINGO!** on **Tuesday**, **October** 7<sup>th</sup> where there will be prizes to win and fun to be had. Games start at 7:00 pm at the Community Hall so come down and grab your cards early.

Taylor Fire Rescue (TFR) will be visiting our local elementary schools to spread the fire prevention week message during the week of Oct 6-10, contact your school for dates and times. Information packages will be going home with students prior to Fire Prevention week.

Taylor Fire Rescue will also be doing Seniors visits on the evening of Wednesday Oct 8th.

#### Charge into Fire Safety: 3 Steps

**Buy only listed products.** When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.

**Charge devices safely.** Always use the cords that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved. Charge your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.

**Recycle batteries responsibly.** Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire. Recycle your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location. Visit <u>call2recycle.org</u> to find a recycling spot near you.

#### Fire Hydrant Markers



Our firefighters have recently installed new reflective hydrant markers throughout town to improve emergency response. These bright markers make hydrants much easier to spot at night, in poor weather, or when blocked by vehicles or snow. By ensuring hydrants remain clearly visible in any condition, the markers help firefighters access water more quickly, reduce response times, and enhance overall public safety.

#### Next Generation 911 (NG911) Upgrades

"When people experience a life-threatening emergency, they need to know they can count on an accessible and reliable 911 system," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "Next Generation 911's advanced technology will help ensure safer and coordinated emergency responses."

Next Generation 911 will improve public safety and confidence in the 911 network. Its features will make the 911 system more accessible for people who choose to communicate confidentially with emergency services, and for people with disabilities who will be able to use different text media to interact with operators. The technology's capacity to provide real-time events will help dispatchers and improve emergency responses.

The District (from the BC provincial government, through a Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) grant) received \$45K to facilitate upgrades locally. These upgrades are allowing Taylor Fire Rescue to have Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) terminals installed in all of its response apparatus. These upgrades will assist the department with a more timely and informed response when answering emergency calls for service. Communications with 911 dispatch, other emergency agencies (such at BC Emergency Health Services, or other local fire departments), and utilizing mapping technology are a game changer for the department.

The CAD tablets and all of their required hardware have now been installed and are in service within our community.




#### **Safety Tip of the Month**

## Do you have a culvert or a ditch in front of your property?



As ditches and culverts form a key part of the District's drainage system, they should not be obstructed under any circumstances. Accumulation of debris can lead to blockage of the pipe and thereby prevent the free flow of water that will eventually overflow the ditch. As well, water flows are affected by culverts that are damaged, commonly by being ran over by vehicles and/or equipment.

Fall is a good time to verify if there is any accumulated dirt, leaves or any form of debris at the entrance or exit of the culvert pipe. In addition, make sure to mow the grass shorter in front of the entrance to ensure proper water flow in the ditch.




# District of Taylor Sani-Dump Area Operation

The Taylor Public Library is directed by a five-member library board which consists of four members from the community and one member from Council.


We are guided by legislation created by the BC Provincial Library Branch called the "Library Act" and a Provincial Strategic Plan for Libraries.



### Community Recipes

#### **Homemade Chili**

My boys and husband love this homemade beef chili recipe with beans that I make in the slow cooker. Add some corn chips or Cheddar cheese and it is always a winner.

Submitted by healthy girl | Tested by Allrecipes Test Kitchen

Prep Time: 10 mins

Cook Time: 4 hrs 15 mins
Total Time: 4 hrs 25 mins

Servings: 12

#### Ingredients

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 large onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced, or more to taste

2 pounds lean ground beef

2 (16 ounce) cans kidney beans, rinsed and drained

1 (28 ounce) can diced tomatoes

1 (15 ounce) can tomato purée

1 cup water

1 (4 ounce) can chopped green chile peppers

2 tablespoons mild chili powder

2 teaspoons salt

2 teaspoons ground cumin

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

#### **Directions**

#### Step 1

Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-low heat. Add onion and garlic; cook and stir until onion is translucent, about 5 minutes. Add ground beef; cook and stir until browned, 8 to 10 minutes.

#### Step 2

Transfer beef mixture to a 6-quart slow cooker. Stir in kidney beans, diced tomatoes, tomato purée, water, green chile peppers, chili powder, salt, cumin, and black pepper.

### Community Recipes

#### Step 3

Cook on Low until flavors combine, 4 to 6 hours.

#### Cook's Note

I use a combination of beans like kidney and black or kidney and garbanzo. I usually use dried beans and cook them in my pressure cooker.

If you can't find tomato purée, just use tomato paste and add water to it to get a purée consistency.

#### **Nutrition Facts**
