Public Engagement

North East BC Emergency & Public Alerts

Critical events happen every day. They threaten safety, disrupt operations and interrupt supply chains. Rapidly pinpointing threats and relaying that information to our residents is important. Your safety is our top concern, that is why communities in North East BC want to make sure you know about emergencies and public alerts as they happen.

The District of Taylor will use the North East BC Emergency and Public Alerts system powered by Everbridge to make sure you know about issues that may affect your safety or routine. This system allows the District of Taylor to contact hundreds of residents in seconds giving us an opportunity to, in a timely and efficient manner, relay to our residents any or all safety issues or disruptions that affect them.

How does it work?

The process begins when the District of Taylor issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern. Next, the North East BC Emergency and Public Alerts system sends a message through your primary contact. If you don't confirm receipt of the message, the system will try to reach your second contact and continue trying to reach you until you confirm receipt.

The Emergency Support Services team in Taylor is looking for volunteers to add to their team. The emergency support services (ESS) purpose is to help preserve the well-being of British Columbians during and/or immediately following an emergency. The ESS program helps people affected by large and small emergencies where residents are forced to evacuate their homes.

A wide range of volunteer positions are needed during an emergency and we all have abilities that can help. ESS is looking for volunteers to train so that Taylor can be more prepared for an emergency. We want you to join us so that when an evacuation does happen we will have more trained people to help us support others in their time of need.

Our team meets once a month on the fourth Tuesday at 7:00pm at the District of Taylor Community Hall. At meetings we review training, practice skills and prepare for what will happen in case of an emergency.

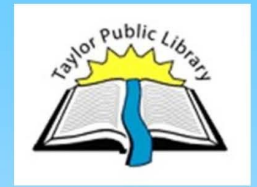

The award winning District Ice Centre provides Taylor and surrounding area residents with a top-notch facility and is the home of local organizations, Peace Passage Skating Club and the Taylor Minor Hockey Association.

The facility offers both a main ice surface and a leisure skating pad. The Main Ice can be booked for special events and the Leisure Pad is open to the public 7 days a week, 12:00pm - 8:00pm Monday to Friday and 10:00am- 8:00pm Saturday and Sunday. during Ice Centre operations. The Ice Centre also offers a large indoor playground and a concession.

When the ice is out, the Ice Centre dry pad is host to the Spirit of the Peace Powwow and the Fort St John & District Kennel Club Dog Show. The dry pad at the District Ice Centre is available for event rentals, offering day and weekend rates.

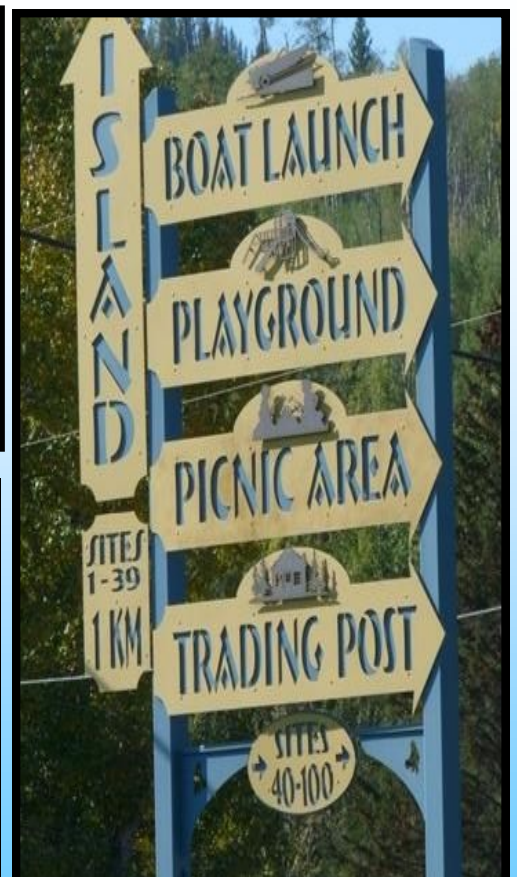
Peace Island Park

Located at Mile 35 of the Alaska Highway, this scenic park is located in the Peace Valley along the mighty Peace River.

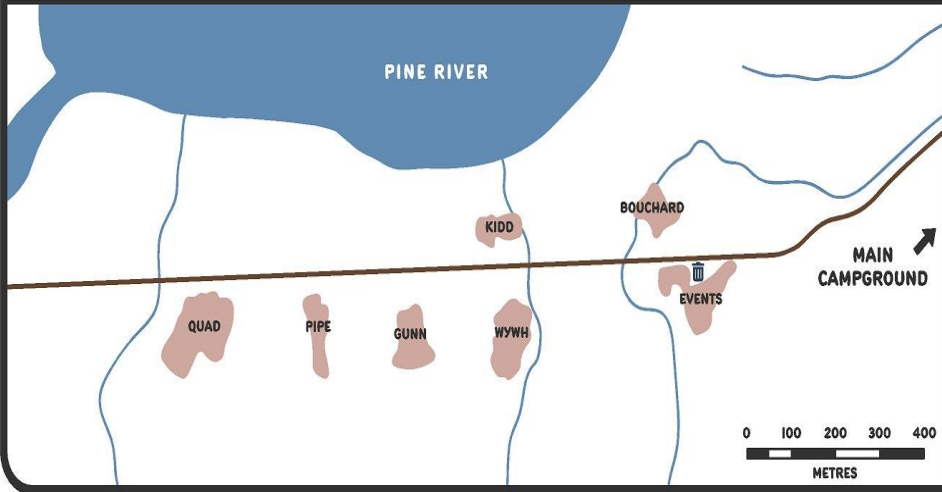
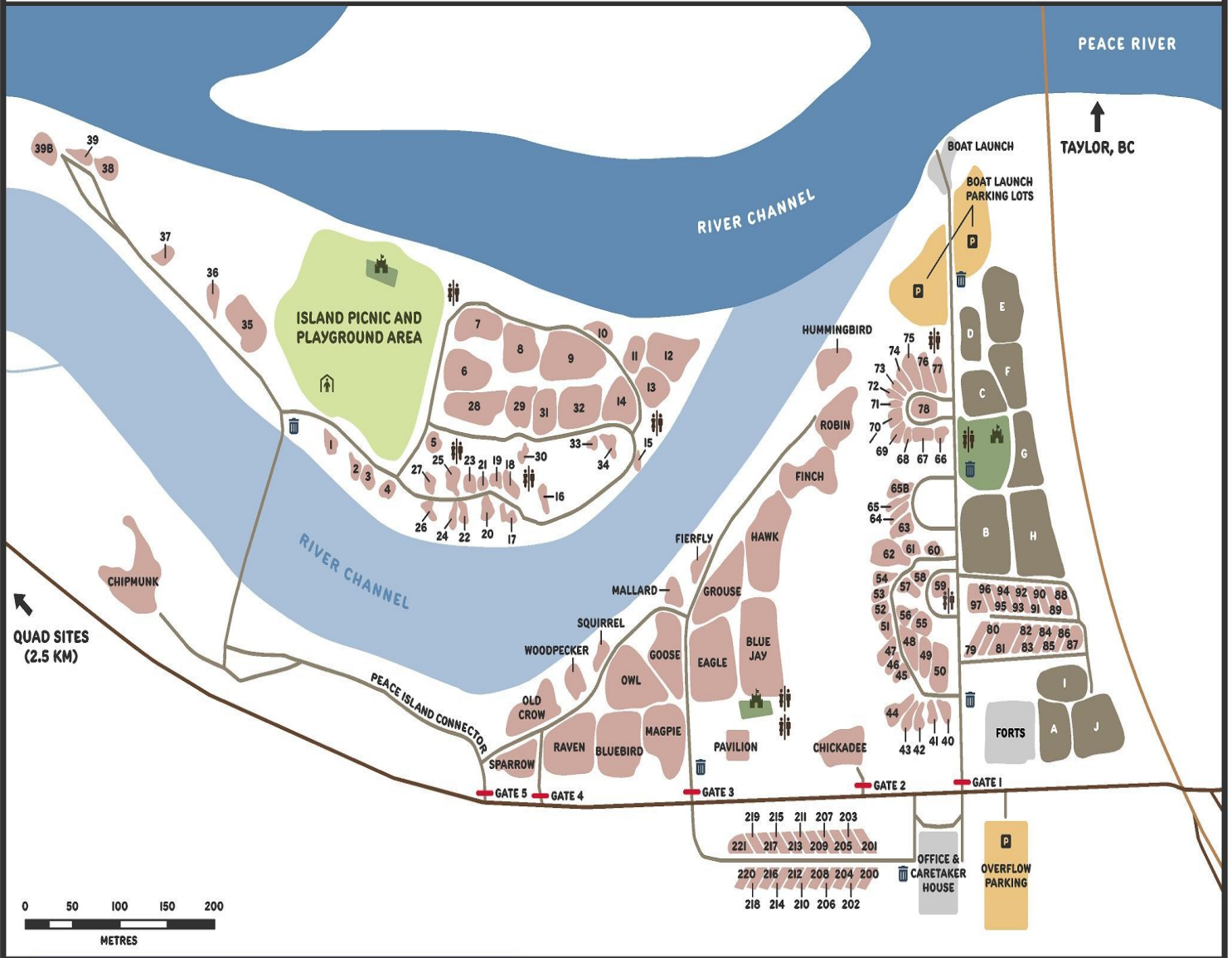

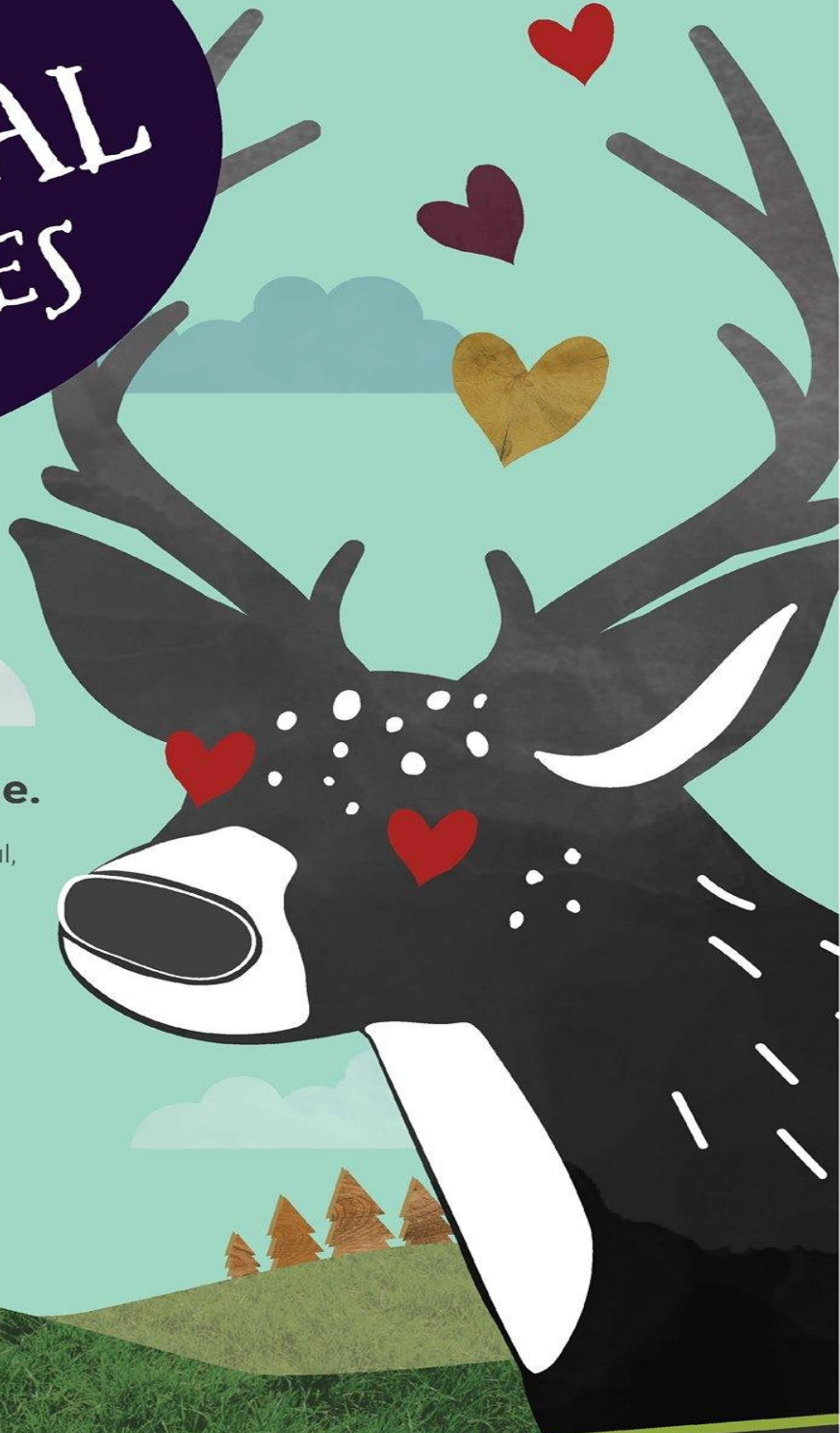
